## COMPREHENSIVE CONSUMER EDUCATION

### COMPREHENSIVE CONSUMER EDUCATION

Helping Flagler and Volusia families find quality childcare is crucial to improving outcomes for both parents and children. In 2020-2021, The Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia Counties, Inc. (ELCFV) provided the community and partners with opportunities to learn about quality childcare and early child development through our Resource and Referral services.

ELCFV continued to form and strengthen partnerships within our community. The Help Me Grow (HMG) grant is now under our coalition which allows us to connect non-SR children to child development questionnaires. Help Me Grow established relationships with child care providers, physicians, pediatric specialists, and local agencies that serve families with children birth to eight (8) years old in Flagler, Volusia and Putnam counties which increased access to developmental screenings.

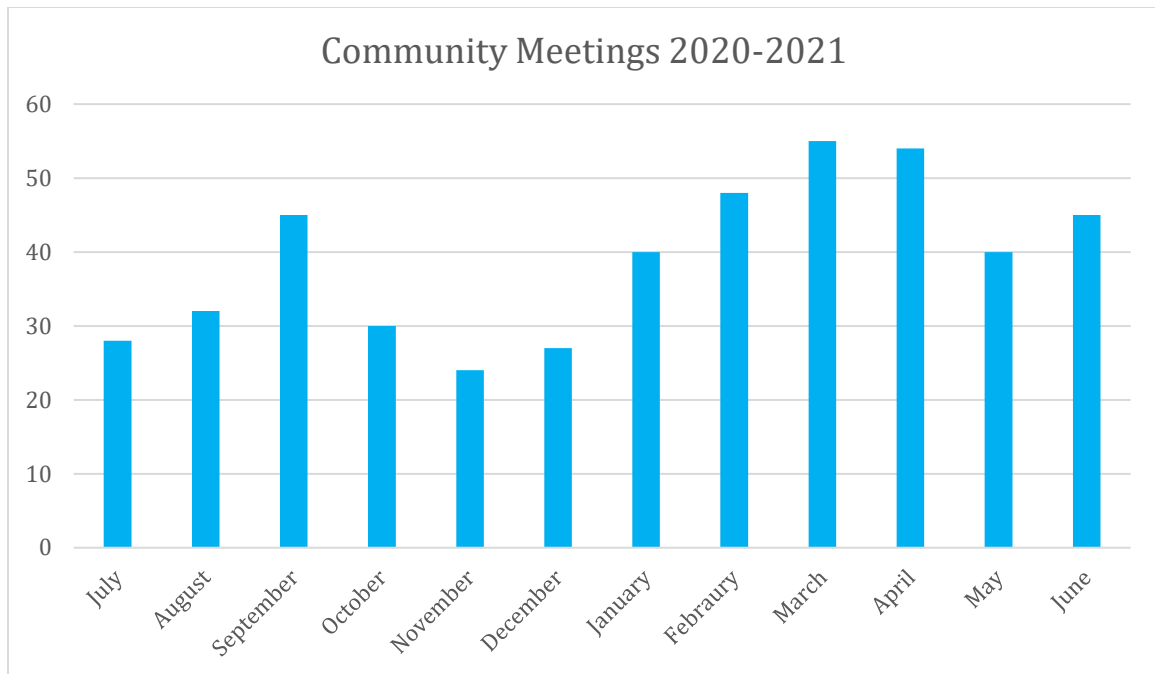
We continued our partnership with Department of Children and Families (DCF) caseworkers on community resources and supports provided by our agency. This connection in partnership with our Family Advocates served as an extension of support services for our at-risk families. Our Family Advocates partnered with local community centers and agencies to offer support services through elective case management, family support services, initiatives such as the 3T's – Tune In, Talk More, Take Turns and Conscious Discipline training. Our Family Advocates attended numerous virtual functions throughout the year to offer consumer education and training opportunities.

ELCFV continued to focus on Family Engagement. One of our primary goals was to “meet parents where they are.” We expanded the family engagement mission by creating the Family Connections by ELCFV newsletter, which focused family engagement tips and activities, resource spotlight, literacy, child development topic with activities and a monthly topic that directly impacted children in our community. Family Connections by ELCFV encouraged participation from families on ways they engage with their child(ren).

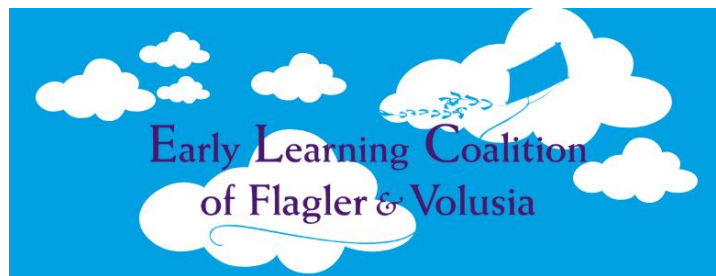
### IN THE COMMUNITY

#### Events & Meetings

Coalition staff attended community meetings and events with the goal of increasing community relationships and public knowledge about services and child development. Meetings included local Chambers of Commerce, Kiwanis Clubs, Rotaries, United Way of Volusia-Flagler, and legislative visits. Below is a chart of community events Coalition staff attended to share resources about quality early learning, child development, and services offered by the Coalition.



## Digital Interactions Community Newsletter



During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the Coalition delivered numerous newsletters, aimed at delivering their mission and reaching supporters near and far. The Coalition added 3 new newsletters amid the COVID-19 pandemic. During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the Coalition continued their monthly deliveries, aimed at continued engagement from community supporters. The newsletters covered materials spanning from coalition events to general information about quality childcare and its impact. Newsletter recipients received one (1) correspondence per month for a total of twelve (12) newsletters throughout the year. The average open rate for the community email newsletter was 35.96%, and the average click rate was 4.48%.

In addition to the community newsletter, a family centered newsletter called Family Connections was added in January 2021, a board newsletter called Board Briefs in April 2021 and a provider newsletter titled Provider Connections began in June of 2021.

- Family Connections started with 153 recipients and has grown to 197 with an average open rate of 38.97% and an average click rate of 2.8%.
- Provider Connections started with 170 recipients and have grown to 171 with an average open rate of 57.9% and an average click rate of 14.6%.

- Board Briefs is sent to 30 recipients with an average open rate of 53.3% and an average click rate of 8.8%

## Provider News

Along with the rest of the world, much of the year was dictated by COVID-19. Communications with providers were often one on one with ELCFV Specialists to address emerging needs. Updates on CDC guidance, documents needed, and available resources were sent out to providers via e-mail as they were received by ELCFV. Information was also posted on our website for any interested stakeholders to access and stay up to date. In June 2021, ELCFV restarted Provider Connections – a monthly newsletter for all contracted providers to promote current and upcoming happenings. Topics included statute/rule changes, training opportunities, safety tips, and reminders for self-care.

To encourage an open dialogue with contracted providers, ELCFV brought back Provider Meetings in March 2021. The virtual meetings are held quarterly, and providers are encouraged to ask questions and suggest topics that will be most helpful to them. Attendance has increased at each meeting thus far.

## Social Media

A dedicated staff member is assigned to improving the Coalition’s social media presence. This focused dedication successfully increased visibility and quality of information posted through the Coalition’s accounts. A variety of community events, fundraising events, current coalition activity, grant partnership efforts and other information sharing efforts were completed.

The Coalition’s Facebook page ([Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia](#)) had 2,635 followers and enjoyed 2,251 likes. On Pinterest ([@elcfv](#)), the coalition had 124 followers and 8 monthly viewers. ELC of Flagler and Volusia’s LinkedIn ([Early Learning Coalition of Flagler & Volusia](#)) had 168 followers. They also had 921 followers on Instagram ([@elcfv](#)).

## Website

The Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia Counties, Inc.’s website continued to be a hub of information for the early learning community in Flagler and Volusia Counties.

### PROVIDER FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

During 2020 – 2021 ELCFV paid the following quality differentials:

Gold Seal Rate to 27 providers - \$809,383.41 (GSQ & GSD)

Quality - \$907,097.15 (QPIs)

CLASS Differentials based on composite scores per qualifying criteria in Rule 6M-4.500(10) as follows:

4% differential to 42 providers

7% differential to 83 providers

10% differential to 6 providers

Child Assessment differential per qualifying criteria in Rule

5% differential to 17 providers

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During the COVID-19 emergency, ELCFV administered DEL grants to providers for Infrastructure and Health and Safety. Using funds under Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES) and Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA), ELCFV processed five rounds of grants for providers totaling \$4,764,878.

In June 2021, ELCFV received donations of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) from Bank of America and Mid-Florida Community Services Head Start. Sixty-five providers signed up for PPE and ELCFV distributed 10,000 masks, 26,000 gloves, and 914 boxes of hand sanitizer.

## TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

### Training & Technical Assistance

ELCFV promoted and offered the following **Professional Development Opportunities**:

1 PreK and 1 Infant/Toddler cohort of **CLASS Group Coaching** (previously titled Making the Most of Classroom Interactions (MMCI) Training) were offered by ELCFV virtually. Seventeen practitioners participating.

There were 69 individual subscriptions to the **Quorum** online training system. Those 69 practitioners completed 304 individual online courses, all of which came with CEUs. Implementation of new knowledge gained in Quorum courses is supported by Communities of Practice facilitated by ELCFV staff.

ELCFV promotes practitioner participation in courses offered by **Flamingo** (previously titled Early Learning Florida). In the Fall 2020 term, 48 practitioners completed 55 courses with mastery. During the Spring 2021 term, 58 practitioners completed 77 courses with mastery.

### Technical Assistance and Practice Based Coaching

Three (3) programs with Quality Improvement Plans in place received **Practice Based Coaching** for their staff.

### Child Screenings and Assessments

4,668 Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) were completed; ASQ is a development screening tool for children ages birth to 6 years old. ASQ are completed by both caregivers and providers. If there are concerns identified, ELCFV Inclusion staff follow up to offer activities and supports.

Sixteen (16) providers participated in Child Assessment with TS GOLD. Participation included maintaining Interrater Reliability and completing AP1, AP2, and AP3.

### Developmentally Appropriate Curricula and Character Development

Ten (10) Family Child Care Home providers participated in training and Communities of Practice on the implementation of Creative Curriculum. Training included exploring the foundation and the daily resources early education professionals have on hand through Creative Curriculum. Topics also

covered included supporting social-emotion development, cognitive, and physical development of children.

### Teacher-Child Interactions

Technical assistance and Practice Based Coaching were provided on the CLASS® dimension of teacher's choice based on their CLASS® score. Fifty-eight (58) practitioners were registered to complete Teachstone's Instructional Support Essentials and were provided the technology to access the on-line self-paced training. Practitioners continue to work on completing the training and receive an Instructional Support Kit once they complete.

### Age-Appropriate Discipline Practices

Technical assistance and Practice Based Coaching on responding to challenging behavior was a part of most warm line responses and based on the Pyramid Model and Conscious Discipline principles. Implementation of strategies to support social emotional development and reduce challenging behavior were a part of the daily work of ELCFV inclusion staff. Staff and providers adapted to much of this work being done virtually due to COVID-19. One provider has completed Pyramid Model (pre-K) training and has begun the implementation process.

### Child Abuse Detection and Prevention

Twenty-five classrooms at 9 programs joined in the Child Abuse Prevention Initiative. Supports included, Safe Smarter Kids curriculum kits, stress relief materials, and strategies for teachers and families. Community of Practice meetings supported implementation of new practice. In addition, ELCFV was one of many local agencies to join with Daytona Dream Center and Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida in an April 2021 Food Drop at City Island. In addition to food, families received bags filled with information and materials to promote safety for all children.

### Let's Go 5-2-1-0 Initiative

Five providers participated in this program that encourages children, families, and program staff to develop healthy habits: eating 5 or more fruits and vegetables, limiting screen time to 2 hours or less, being physically active for at least 1 hours and eliminating sugary drinks. Providers were given materials to support development of healthy habits including classroom container gardens, playground equipment and water dispensers. These items contributed to high quality environments and supported progress in physical health standards. Monthly handouts about developing healthy habits were sent home for families. Practitioners completed online training through Quorum and received support from Communities of Practice.

Three programs in Southeast Volusia received fresh fruits and vegetables for the children with local grant funding.

### Equity in Action for ELCFV Staff

During FY 2020 – 2021 ELCFV implemented an Equity in Action program in partnership with The Equity Institute at ELC Miami Dade Monroe. Equity in Action was designed to support and educate ELCFV staff in the adoption of inclusive values for all employees and more specifically to increase awareness and promote acceptance and inclusive values for all children and families served. The program consisted of 6 2.5-hour sessions presented by The Equity Institute every other month. On alternating months, the ELC of Flagler & Volusia lead internal sessions to dig deeper on the topics

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presented. Topics included our personal histories, implicit bias, microaggression, erasure of history, the relationship between equity and poverty and anti-bias education. Guest speakers included Nicole Martin Bynum from the Florida ECCS Impact Project and Umut Dursum and Dani Dominguez from the YES Institute.

## QUALITY ACTIVITIES FOR INFANT AND TODDLER CARE

### Infant & Toddler

ELCFV specialists were trained in the 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers. This model was used with a provider on a Quality Improvement Plan to personalize their path to quality care by building foundations, relationships, language & learning, and family supports.

### Babies Rock

From July 2019 through February 2020, 6 volunteers visited infants' rooms at 5 providers. This program was suspended during the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Quality Activities for All Ages that Engage the Community

### The Learning Mobile

Five community events were completed with the learning mobile and twenty-one events without the learning mobile. During community events and learning mobile visits, staff modeled quality interaction with children, provided resources to families and opportunities for children to experience early learning activities.



### Officer Friendly

Due to COVID-19, Officer Friendly was moved on-line. Officers from local Police and Sheriff's Departments virtually read a book to children in multiple classrooms at 20 programs in Bunnell, Holly Hill, Ormond Beach, Daytona Beach Deltona, Pierson, and Seville. After reading the book, the children asked questions of the officer. The program moved to an on-line model where 380 children were able to have positive virtual interaction with law enforcement.

### Firefighter Friendly

Due to COVID-19, Firefighter Friendly was moved on-line. 2 Firefighters in Bunnell and Palm Coast

virtually read books about fire safety to 120 children in 5 child care programs in Flagler County.

## Literacy Initiatives

ELCFV provided literacy supports through quarterly literacy initiatives including JumpStart Read for the Record with 34 programs participating, Just Read Florida with 28 programs participating. For both initiatives ELCFV provided copies of the book and, when relevant, materials to support activities based on the books.

## Therapy Dogs

This program continued to be suspended due to COVID-19.

### MONITORING

148 were completed (78 SR; 70 VPK)

## CLASS® Observations

A total of 362 CLASS® assessments were completed by ELCFV staff: 75 Infant, 124 Toddler and 163 Pre-K. Assessments were completed in 127 programs.

## ASQ Monitoring

Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQs) were completed by parents at time of eligibility determination/redetermination. When ASQs were required to be performed by providers, providers accessed the Brookes' Enterprise system via the ELCFV website to print paper copies of ASQs for classroom teacher use. Results were entered directly into Brookes' system by the provider upon completion of the questionnaire.

ELCFV used a combination of EFS codes and a spreadsheet to track provider completion of required ASQs. An email reminder was sent to providers a minimum of 30 days prior to the ASQ due date and the Brooke's system was monitored to ensure completion. When the provider did not submit the ASQ, ELCFV issued a letter of non-compliance with the SR Contract to the provider and stated:

- The provider must correct the non-compliance by submitting the ASQ and/or parent permission
- SR funding will be withheld until the ASQ and/or permission was submitted
- The provider's SR contract will be terminated if corrective action required had not been completed within 10 calendar days after the date of the letter

During Fiscal Year 2020-2021, no SR contracts were terminated due to failure to administer and submit ASQ screenings.

An update completed in EFS towards the end of 2020-2021 moved completion of the ASQ into EFS for both the parent and provider. ELCFV continued to process all completed ASQ and requested rescreening when necessary.

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## Grant Compliance

Each grant identified a set of deliverables. Each deliverable was calendared and reported to the grantor as required (typically monthly, but at least quarterly, as outlined in each grant). ELCFV ensured deliverables were met, aligned with applicable laws, participated in internal audits, and reported data frequently, which ensured that we continuously maintained compliance with all requirements throughout the year. Local grantors provided on-site monitoring and ELCFV demonstrated faultless compliance.

## INCLUSION

### Inclusion

In 2020-2021 ELCFV continued to implement a wholistic approach to inclusion. To further promote this practice and improve customer service, Child Development staff, who were previously a part of Family Services, joined the Inclusion Department. This streamlined the process by having one ELCFV staff assigned to the child who communicates with the parents, provider, and any other parties who work towards the implementing individualized services.

Quality Initiative staff used a multi-step approach in responding to inclusion challenges. This approach began with building provider/family relationships, moved to identifying ways to make classrooms more inclusive and includes support for screening and referrals where needed. When these steps don't provide the desired level of success, QI staff worked with provider and family on a transition plan so that the next placement has increased likelihood of being successful. When possible, other child welfare agencies were included in the planning process.

Inclusion related training completed by practitioners in 2020-2021 included Quorum courses as follows: Helping Children Embrace Racial Diversity, Basics of Inclusion, Building Strong Relationships with Families, Child Care During COVID-19, Family Engagement: The Road to Better Outcomes for Children, and Honoring All Families.
